Theory Examinations: Primary Responsibility: The Course Instructor typically serves as the paper setter and examiner for both the Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and the End-of-Semester Examination (EoSE). External Oversight: To maintain high standards, the Vice Chancellor reserves the right to appoint external paper setters and examiners for the EoSE when deemed necessary. 2. Practical & Project-Based Evaluations: For courses involving laboratory work, design, fieldwork, or projects, evaluations (including reports, models, dissertations, and viva-voce) are conducted by a specialized Jury/Panel. The composition and approval process for this panel differ to ensure impartiality: For Internal Assessment (CIA): The evaluation panel is approved by the Head of Department (HoD)/Director. It must include the instructor and at least one external expert, although an internal-only panel may be permitted if logistical challenges arise. For End-of-Semester (EoSE): The evaluation panel is approved by the Dean. It is mandatory for this panel to include the instructor/project guide and at least one external expert from outside the University. 3. Major Dissertation Courses: In special cases, such as for semester-long dissertation courses that constitute a majority of the semester's credits, the appointment of the evaluation jury is overseen at the highest level. The Vice Chancellor will directly nominate or approve the final panel based on recommendations from the HoD, Director, or Dean.</p>

Result Processing and Declaration Workflow: The University follows a rigorous, multi-stage process to ensure the timely, accurate, and fair declaration of examination results.

Step 1: Evaluation & Submission (Department Level): Answer Scripts: Course Instructors must complete the evaluation of End-Semester Examination scripts and submit results to the **Head of Department (HoD)** via the Departmental Coordinator **within one week.**

Practicals/Projects: For practical, project, or internship-based courses, the **Course Coordinator** submits a duly signed award list to the HoD.

Step 2: Review & Draft Publication (HoD Level): The **HoD** conducts a preliminary review of the submitted results. Following the review, the HoD publishes the **draft results** as per the schedule provided by the Controller of Examinations (CoE) and forwards a copy to the **Dean.**

Step 3: Verification & Moderation (Dean Level): The **Dean** verifies the results forwarded by the HoD. In case of anomalies, the Dean may recommend **moderation**, which requires the **Vice Chancellor's (VC)** approval. The Dean then forwards the verified final results to the **CoE.**

Step 4: Final Processing & Declaration (CoE & VC Level): The **CoE** conducts a final sample check of the results and makes necessary corrections. With the **VC's final approval**, the **CoE** prepares and officially **declares the final results.**

Step 5: Final Recourse & Record Keeping: Final Review: The **CoE** has the authority to refer any further irregularities to a formal **moderation committee.**
